


For 40 years the O'Neill Center has provided older adults in Washington County and surrounding areas with vital services and life enrichment activities.

SERVICES OFFERED

2,464 Individuals served in 2025

Over 550 served

Support services helped numerous individuals access the information they needed to make well-informed Medicare decisions, delivered caregiver guidance through Care Consultations, provided prescription assistance to older adults, and offered a wide range of additional resources.

Over 4,000 days of care provided

The **Day Center** provides clients a safe environment with health and wellness monitoring including nutritious breakfast, lunch and snack. The Day Center also has transportation available.

Over 9,350 trips taken

Throughout 2025, our specially trained drivers provided 281 seniors with safe, handicap-accessible **transportation**, ensuring they were comfortably escorted to and from their medical appointments.

Over 2,800 hours of in-home assistance

Over 70 seniors benefited from our **Living Assistance Program** — a dedicated service designed exclusively for Washington County residents age 60 and older. This personalized support helps older adults maintain their independence and comfort at home by providing light housekeeping, grocery shopping, laundry services, and even seasonal deep cleaning.

Over 32,619 visits

Life Enrichment Activities at the O'Neill and Belpre Centers are designed to have a positive impact on the health and well-being of adults ages 50 and above. With arts & crafts, education, fitness, health screenings and travel being offered, seniors can live a healthy, independent, and productive life.

Other Impacts

Accepting donations that provided over **100 grocery boxes** in addition to **nutritious prepared meals** for those in need and having a **Community Food Pantry** onsite and are just a few of the ways our team have address food insecurities among older adults.
